We would like to thank Mrs Falvell and Mrs Jones who have both been teaching in these classes this term.

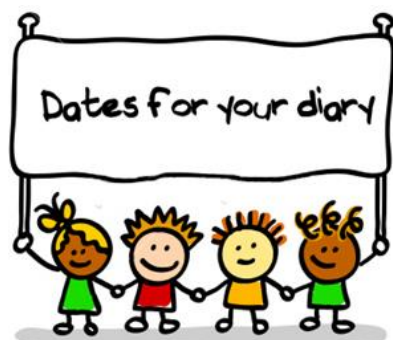
Reminders for the New Year

School Uniform - We regularly get comments about how smart our children look and maintaining this is really important to us. Thank you for ensuring your children come to school in the correct school uniform – shirt, tie, trousers/skirt, black or grey socks, appropriate school shoes and jumper/cardigan. Please can hair accessories be small and discrete; huge bows are not suitable for school. Children will also need an outdoor coat to wear on the playground as the wintery weather progresses. A reminder that small stud earrings and watches are the only jewellery allowed and nail varnish should be removed.

Attendance – Our school target is 97%. Our current attendance figure is 95.99%

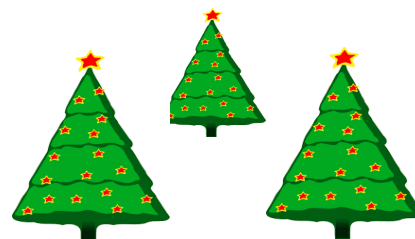
