Just in case we get any inclement weather, I would like to remind you of the procedures that are in place at school. We will aim to clear the site and open as many entrances as possible but during severe weather, we will prioritise clearing the main entrance on **Cot Lane** and the entrance on **Pleasant Close**.

We always aim to stay open when it snows but in the event of the Local Authority not making a blanket decision, the decision to close school will be at the discretion of the Headteacher and Chair of Governors. This decision will be based on health and safety risk assessments. If a decision is taken to close, information will be shared with local radio stations, a message will be sent via Parent Hub and a notice will also be added to the school website.
